### INTERVENTION

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**IN SUPPORT OF ITS PRESENT APPLICATION FOR INTERVENTION PURSUANT  
TO RULE 8 OF THE REGULATION RESPECTING THE PROCEDURE OF THE  
RÉGIE DE L'ÉNERGIE, THE INTERVENOR HEREBY STATES :**

1. Ontario Power Generation Inc. (hereinafter "OPG") is a corporation registered in Ontario which owns and operates a significant portfolio of electricity generation plants in the Province of Ontario;
2. OPG is one of three (3) main successor companies to Ontario Hydro, which ceased operation on April 1, 1999. The others being Hydro One Inc., which includes the transmission and retail energy services businesses formerly held by Ontario Hydro, and the Independent Electricity Market Operator, a not-for-profit corporation established to operate Ontario's electricity markets;
3. OPG operates independently of Ontario's Independent Electricity Market Operator and Hydro One Inc.;
4. OPG buys and sells electricity from and into the interconnected markets of other provinces and the U.S. northeast and Midwest;
5. OPG believes that the questions raised and the decisions rendered in the present proceedings will affect the market conditions prevailing within *Quebec*;
6. OPG therefore requests an intervenor status in the present proceedings;

7. OPG considers itself as a valid, reliable potential supplier of power to Quebec distributors, including HQD as well as to neighbouring markets and as such a potential user of TransEnergie's transmission system.
8. As a potential user of the system, OPG has obvious interest in this case, both legal and pecuniary;
9. As a prospective point-to-point service customer of TransEnergie, OPG's primary objective in this proceeding, as in Case R-3401 is to ensure that it, along with other competitors, has a fair opportunity to secure desired transmission service on TransEnergie's system.
10. In order for such fair opportunity to be available, the rate design must be based on cost allocation methodologies that are consistent and devoid of any discrimination and the terms and conditions of use and access to the system must be fair and reasonable. Both, methodologies and conditions, must be compatible with the principles and usage generally accepted and applied in neighbouring jurisdictions, markets and systems.
11. OPG's involvement during this Phase 2 will probably be limited to the allocation of costs the complaint procedure, the discount policy, the cost of ancillary services and of course the rates and the terms and conditions of service.
12. OPG expects to produce Information Requests on the above subjects, expects to cross-examine witnesses on these subjects and, depending on the answers to the I/Rs, may produce expert or ordinary evidence. The presentation (in chief) of that evidence will not in any case exceed 30 minutes.  
The recommendations made or conclusions sought will aim at ensuring that the principles expounded in paragraph 10 above are respected and followed.
13. OPG does not intend to ask for the reimbursement of its costs.


