Your business may also be eligible for additional demand response programs offered by the New York Independent System Operator.

## **Demand Response Programs Details**

Both the 21 Hour and the 2 Hour Notification Programs have a Reservation Payment Option and a Voluntary Participation Option. A customer can participate in one option in either one or both programs.

#### **Reservation Payment Option**

Customers who enroll in a Reservation Payment option will receive monthly payments based on the amount of energy they have pledged to reduce upon request. These customers receive additional payments for actual load reduced. Customers receive payments regardless of whether Con Edison requests to reduce electrical usage.

Customers in the 2 Hour or Less Notification Program (Distribution Load Relief Program, DLRP)
Reservation Payment Option will receive a \$6.00 per kW per month and \$1.00 for each kWh that is reduced during an event if they are located in a Tier 1 network. Customers located in Tier 2 networks will receive \$15 per kW per month and \$1.00 for each kWh that is reduced during an event. Contact us to confirm the network tier of your building.

Customers in the 21 Hour Notification Program (Commercial System Relief Program, CSRP) will receive \$10.00 per kW per month and \$1.00 for each kWh that is reduced during an event.

### Three Year Incentive Payment

Customers enrolled in the Reservation Payment Option are eligible for a substantial Three Year Incentive Payment, in addition to payments described above.

To qualify, customers must pledge an enrollment amount for two additional years that is equal to or greater than their enrollment in the first year of participation. Customers must reduce at least 80 percent of what was pledged on average for all test and event hours over the course of the capability period.

Customers can participate in the Three Year Incentive Payment for both programs.

Qualifying customers in the 2 Hour Notification Program Reservation Payment Option will receive \$5 per kW per pledged or reduced (whichever is lower) per month over three seasons of participation (each season lasts from May until September).

Customers in the 21 Hour Notification Program Reservation Payment Option will receive \$10 per kW per pledged or reduced (whichever is lower) per month over three seasons of participation.

### **Voluntary Participation Option**

Customers enrolled in the CSRP or DLRP Voluntary Participation option only receive payments if Con Edison requests and they reduce energy. These customers receive \$3.00 for each kWh reduced.

Customers In the Voluntary Participation Option do not need to participate in a test event.

### Requirements

Interested in Getting Paid to Use Less Energy - Con Edison of New York

- Customers enrolled in the Reservation Payment option are required to participate in a one hour test event per program every year.
- Customers must maintain electric reduction for at least 4 hours during non-test events.
- Con Edison may issue requests to reduce usage between May 1 and September 30.
- CSRP Customers must be able to respond to demand response events Monday Friday and during the call window of the network they are located in.
- DLRP customers must be able to respond to demand response events from 6:00 AM to 12:00 AM any day of the week.
- Energy usage reduction during the test and all events is measured using the Con Edison's Customer Baseline Load procedure.

#### Restrictions

The 21 Hour Notification Program has a limitation on Distributed Generation (DG) and exclusion of DG other than renewable resources that are in close proximity to certain electric generators. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation maps show the geographical areas where DG is prohibited.

#### **Apply Now**

For full program rules, read through Riders U (DLRP) and S (CSRP) of our tariff. Enrollments will be accepted up to August 1st for a September 1st start date.

We encourage you to apply through an Aggregator. If are able to reduce 50 kW or more, you can also apply directly with Con Edison.

To apply directly complete and submit the Demand Response Programs Application and the Demand Response Enrollment Information for individual or aggregated load.
